### 6 BIBBULMAN NOONGAR SEASONS



The Noongar people are from the South West of Western Australia which includes Quinns Rocks. They have a very close connection with the earth. They divided the year into 6 seasons. When each season would come, they would often go to a new place to hunt for food.

**Makuru** is in June and July

**Djilba** is in August and September

**Kambarang** is in October and November

**Birak** is in December and January

**Bunuru** is in February and March

**Djeran** is in April and May

The school buildings have been named after these seasons.
