<p>Willie Wagtails are found in open forests and woodlands. They tend to prefer the wetter areas, with lots of leaf-litter, for feeding, and available mud for nest building.</p> <p>Willie Wagtails are active feeders. Birds can be seen darting around lawns as they hunt for insects on the ground. As they do so, the tail is wagged from side to side. Insects are also captured in the air, in active chases.</p>	<p>Willie Wagtails eat insects, so we need to make sure that there are insects in the school ground.</p> <p>They like to hunt insects on lawns and in leaf litter. Insects hide in leaf litter so we should not have the areas under trees raked to remove all the leaves.</p> <p>We need to have trees to make the leaf litter and open space like lawns.</p>
